



How can I give money to Orchard Baptist church?

"Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver."

2 Corinthians 9 v7

There are some simple ways of giving towards the work of the Church:

1. By Standing Order on a regular basis directly from your bank.

Ask Richard Bolam or Peter Allott for a form or you can download one from the giving to the church page in the about us section of the church website. If you are a tax payer you can gift aid this to increase the money the church receives.



2. By weekly or monthly envelopes.



This enables you to set aside some money on a regular basis so that even if you miss a week the church will receive your money next time you come. If you are a tax payer, by having an identifiable envelope or by using cheques, the church can receive extra funding through a tax refund. See Richard for a set of envelopes. If you don't pay tax, keep reading...

3. By putting money in the offering bags.

We can also claim gift aid on individual cash donations (even if you aren't a tax payer) of up to £20. For this reason it is more effective if people who give this way use cash rather than cheques as this increases the money the church receives as long as the gift is not clearly over £20 in one go, eg. notes folded together.



4. Giving directly to the Manse Fund to help pay off the mortgage.

You can do this by standing order to the Manse fund, by envelope and/or by using a collecting box. Again, the advice above about whether or not you pay tax also applies to these gifts. Talk to Richard or Peter if you want to know more or if you need a form.
